

Hook-a-duck

Equipment

Empty plastic milk bottles
Stapler
String
Stick
Tub
Optional – acrylic paint pens

Vocabulary

Core – again, big, close, come, different, do, don't, fast, get, go, good, help, I, in, it, like, little, look, mad, me, mine, more, my, off, on, out, play, put, ready, slow, stop, take, that, turn, up, you

Fringe – duck, wet, yellow, water, splash

What to do

Cut out some duck shapes from a plastic milk bottle (I cut out 4)

Optional: decorate with acrylic pens

Cut out the same number of rings out of a plastic milk bottle (see pictures below for guidance)

Fold one side of the rings and attach to the ducks with a stapler so that the rings stick upwards

Cut out a hook shape out of a plastic milk bottle (see pictures below for guidance)

Tie one end of a piece of string to a hook and the other end to a stick so that you create a fishing rod.

Fill a tub with water and place your ducks so they're floating on top.

Fish for your ducks!

Sentence Ideas

1WL – get, go, fast, slow, in, help, stop, look, again, come, play, turn, on, off, different

2WL – get it, let's go, help me, go slow, look it, like this, help me, stop there, don't do

3WL - look it in, get it on, let's play again, that was close, help me please, look it's in

Language Functions

Requesting – help me please, can I go?

Directing – not so fast, stop there, take it slow, take it out, don't do that, my turn now

Commenting – like this game, I'm mad go in, that was good, look it's in

Refusing – Stop now, not wet, don't like wet

Interjecting – oh no! yay!

You could use these core words and example sentences to model during other fairground games this summer!

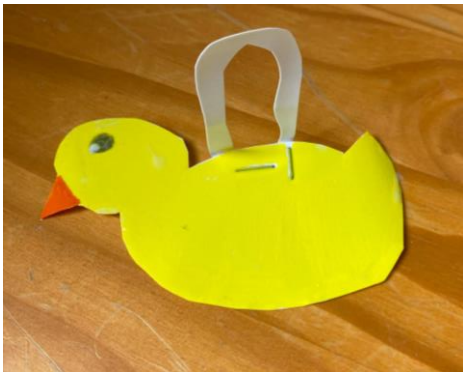
