

# Rainbow hand printing

## **Equipment**

- Paint
- Range of brushes
- Plates
- Aprons
- Paper

# Vocabulary

Core – again, different, do, feel, get, good, bad, happy, help, put, stop, take, like, look, want, that, more, all done, open, close, ready, go, on, off, it, not

Fringe – rainbow, paint, paper

## What to do

First get your materials ready:

- 1. Put on your aprons!
- 2. Put a little bit of each colour paint on a plate
- 3. Give each person a range of brushes
- 4. Place a sheet of paper on the table in front of each person

Now time to paint!

- 1. Use your dominant hand to paint colours in stripes on your other hand
- 2. Then place your hand on the paper to make a rainbow hand print!
- 3. Try creating a classic rainbow shape with your prints on the paper

NB – This activity can be further adapted dependent on the ability of the individual you are supporting. If the person needs a high-level of physical support this can be provided. If the individual will be unable to physically manipulate the items, they can direct others.

#### Sentence Ideas

1WL – go, all done, like, feel, look, help, different

2WL – do it, I help, I do, my turn, take off, put on, different one, look good, bad one

3WL – make a rainbow, don't like it, it feels good, it feels yucky, wash it off

### **Language Functions**

Requesting – more, want more, I want more

Directing - do, you do, you do it

Commenting – good, it good, like it good

Refusing – stop, want stop, want stop it

Interjecting – awesome, it awesome, that is awesome

#### Generalisation

Try cutting out the handprints and turning them into something else (e.g. a turkey or a butterfly!)
