# What to do

This month we're going on a spooky scavenger hunt in search of all things Halloweeny!

Grab your checklist and get searching in your preferred location – typically this may be out and about when on a walk perhaps or when trick or treating. But you may wish to do an alternative version – perhaps you could search for the things in TV adverts? Or Halloween specials of your favourite TV shows? Maybe you'd like to do a spooky search around school. What about searching through a Halloween edition of a supermarket magazine or the supermarket itself? The possibilities are endless!

You can use the activity to model lots of descriptive language as you cross off items and can explore prepositions as you comment on where you can see the items you are searching for.

As always you can adapt the activity to suit the physical needs of the individual engaging in the activity.

3WL – look that scary, I like that, I don't like, stop it scary, my turn look,
